
Who We Are, What We Do

- Strategic partnership of 13 organizations with ultimate goal of supporting the development and sustainability of an Africa-centered network
- Dedicated to accelerating biomedical HIV prevention research, and the introduction of and equitable access to a range of HIV prevention options
- Partners develop and implement advocacy action plans based on their organizational priorities and analyses of needs in their country/community
- 9 Africa-based organizations in 6 countries, driving CS engagement and key advocacy priorities
- 4 US/northern-based organizations working in solidarity and providing technical and strategic support
- AVAC is currently the prime (2016-2026) but with a commitment to transitioning leadership over the life of the project





CASPR's Guide: Biomedical Prevention Pipeline






Biomedical Px Pipeline of Projects

Ensuring Prevention Product Development Reflects Needs of Those Most Affected







SA Consultation on bNAbs for Infant Prophylaxis (IAVI, Feb 2023): Concerns from Advocates

- 15-25 minutes bNAb administering/injection time
- Progression of infant efficacy trials on the basis of safety data from Phase 1 trials in adults - researchers have very limited safety and tolerability data of combination bNABs in infants
- bNAb product profile needs to have a long half-life to reduce the number of administrations needed during breastfeeding - need for researchers to develop longer-acting bNAbs – that last over 6 months or more.
- Could existing (CAB-LA) & up-coming (LEN) long-acting ARVbased prevention modalities be better options for post-natal prevention/prophylaxis?



Over-promising: bNAbs positioned as cheaper, affordable and a technology that can be easily manufactured in-sub-Saharan Africa







Role of Advocates as Advisors in Clinical Trials


